JAMES R. MARTIN

Office of the Under Secretary of Defense
(Intelligence)



Jim Martin was appointed Assistant Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence (Portfolio, Programs, and Resources) in March 2009. He is responsible for executive oversight of numerous programs with intelligence capabilities across the armed services and defense agencies.

In January 2007, Mr. Martin became Director, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Programs, Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Portfolio, Programs, and Resources), Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence. In this position, he was responsible for Department of Defense oversight of space, airborne, and surface based reconnaissance and surveillance systems.

He served as Chief, Force Structure and Investment, with the National Security Division of the Office of Management and Budget from 2005 to 2007. From there he provided oversight of Research, Development, Test and Evaluation and all Procurement programs of the Department of Defense, as well as military construction and housing, and the National Nuclear Security Agency of the Department of Energy. From 2002 to 2005, Mr. Martin served as a senior budget examiner for Space and Missile Defense programs.

Between 2000 and 2002, he worked in the Defense Department as the Deputy Director for Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance programs within the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Command, Control, Communications and Intelligence (ASD/C3I). Between 1998 and 2000, Mr. Martin was a Senior Manager for Business Development in the Raytheon Corporation, assigned to their Washington office. His portfolio included all space product lines for military, civil, and commercial users.

Mr. Martin retired from the United States Air Force in 1998, having served in a variety of assignments including navigator and electronic warfare officer duties in B-52 and RC-135 aircraft; a systems requirements officer at the National Reconnaissance Office; a reconnaissance staff officer in the Defense Intelligence Agency; and numerous headquarters positions at United States Space Command, Air Force Space Command, and the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

He is a graduate of the Air Force Academy and in 1985 received a Master of Science in Space Operations Engineering from the Air Force Institute of Technology.
